GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

State of Kentucky, County of Gallatin SS:

ON THIS 19th day of Febry A. D. 1897, personally appeared before me

a Circuit Court Clerk In and for the aforesaid County duly authorized to administer oaths

Francis M. Gullion aged 36 years, a resident of Sugar Creek In the County of Gallatin and State of Kentucky and

well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case

as follows:

I was born & raised in the same neighborhood with Nathaniel H. Scudder and Jane Scudder his wife her maiden name being Jane Gullion, from infancy say for at least fifty years or as far back as I can remember. I know that neither were ever married except the one marriage that is Nathaniel H. Scudder to Jane Gullion the applicant for pension above named. I know that she is his legal widow as they remained husband and wife from the date of their marriage up to said Nathaniel H. Scudder's death. I know that neither owned any real estate at this time or at date of Nathaniel H. Scudder's death. I know that all said Jane Scudder has in their way of property is some few household effects a small quantity of provisions some few farming utensils and a cow and calf all of which would exceed in value the sum of twenty five dollars that sum includes his crop of tobacco raised last year 1896. I am satisfied that Nathaniel H. Scudder never served in the U. S. A. or navy only as private in Co. G, 139th Regt Ind Vol Inf. I know that Nathaniel H. Scudder left no children under sixteen years of age except when he died except Ulie - Carroll & Dilson. I further state that said Jane Scudder has not remarried since the death of said Nathaniel H. Scudder. I know that no one is legal bound to support said Jane Scudder and that she has to depend upon her daily labor for her support. I know that said Nathaniel H. Scudder & Jane Scudder were never divorced. This affidavit is written by Jas W. Craig of Warsaw Kentucky in my presence and only at my oral dictation at Warsaw Ky on this 19 day of Febry 1897.
