Notes for Jane Gibson:

By tradition, Jane was a sister of the other Gibson brothers who stayed behind in Ireland.

- 4 iii. Thomas Gibson, died 1763 in West Fallowfield, Chester Co., PA. He married Mary Weldin.

Notes for Thomas Gibson:

The minutes of what is presumed to be the Londonderry Presbytery, dated 24 November 1741, noted that a "purpose" of marriage between Thomas Gibson and Mary Weldon had been published, but that William Crosby entered objections, as Mary had promised to marry him. Nonetheless, Thomas and Mary married. After the death of Thomas, Mary married Rev. John Wallace and had issue. Thomas Gibson first appears in the 1751 tax list of West Fallowfield. It would appear that he is the best possibility to have been the father of Jacob Gibson and Robert Gibson of West Fallowfield, Chester Co., Pennsylvania.

### **2. Alexander<sup>2</sup> Gibson** (Unknown<sup>1</sup>) died 1783 in West Fallowfield Twp. Chester Co., PA.

Notes for Alexander Gibson:

Alexander and George Gibson appear in the tax lists for Londonderry from 1735 to 1740. From 1749-1750 he is listed in West Fallowfield with one hundred acres. His wife's name is unknown, although he could be the Alexander Gibson who married Mary Gillespie on 14 Nov. 1739 at the First Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia. He died intestate and his estate was administered by Isaac and Samuel Gibson.

Notes for Alexander Gibson:

Alexander never married. He died in Rowan Co., North Carolina, "late of Chester County, Pennsylvania, now of Rowan County, North Carolina." He made his will dated 26 October 1773. He left his estate to his father and mother; his brother, Dr. Isaac Gibon; his nephew, Alexander, son of his brother, John; his nephew, Alexander, son of his brother James and his nephew, Alexander Fleming, son of his sister. The remainder of his estate went to his three brothers; John, James and Samuel. He also mentioned his brothers-in-law William Dizert, James Fleming and Andrew Newberry. This will was proven 1 November 1774 in Chester Co., Pennsylvania.

Notes for Ann \_\_\_\_\_:

Rebecca was the widow of John Starrett. Isaac was referred to as Dr. Isaac Gibson in the will of his brother Alexander. The will of Rachel Gardner of Honeybrook Twp., Chester Co., Pennsylvania, dated 29 December 1772, gives to Ann, wife of Dr. Isaac Gibson, and to her son, James, son of John Sarrett, deceased.

WILL OF ANDREW GIBSON

Chester Co., Pa., Will Book K, vol. 10, pp. 438-439

Be it Remembered that I Andrew Gibson sabler of West Fallowfield Township County of Chester and State of Pennsylvania being in weak health and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following. Imprimis I will and appoint that all my past debts funeral expences be paid out of my Estate by my Executors hereinafter named.

Item I will & bequeath unto my Daughter Rebecca the wife of William Read the Sum of five shillings Pennsylvania Currency.

Item I will & bequeath unto my beloved son Jacob Gibson five shillings Currency. I give and bequeath unto my beloved son George Gibson the sum of five shillings currency as I have already given him a plantation, which he hath sold for five hundred Pounds.

Item I will and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Mary Gibson the sum of three Pounds Currency yearly and every year to be paid during her natural life by my Executors hereafter named together with her bed and its furniture . . . whatsoever she hath purchased or whatsoever she may justly claim to be at her own disposal. Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Thomas Gibson the sum of five shillings Currency which together with the Plantation which he now lives on containing one hundred acres be the same more or less and also the full ... with all its appurtenances thereto belonging I consider as his proportion of my estate.

Item I will bequeath unto my beloved son Andrew Gibson the sum of five pounds Currency to be deducted out of the sum of one Hundred and fifty pounds which he now owes to me and the remainder viz. one hundred and Twenty Five Pounds to be appropriated to the discharge of the Legacies herein mentioned.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret the wife of William Lyon the sum of forty pounds also to my Daughter Sarah the wife of William Criswell the sum of fifty pounds and to my Daughter Agness the wife of James Criswell the sum of forty pounds and also to my Daughter Jane the wife of Jacob Weedon the sum of Forty pounds exclusive of all which they have received of me.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Grandson Andrew Gibson the son of Thomas Gibson the sum of Ten pounds for his Use to be put to interest until he arrive to the age of twenty one years.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my grandchildren Andrew Lyon; Andrew Gibson Criswell, son of my daughter Agnes; Andrew Gibson Criswell son of James; Samuel Criswell Gibson, son of Thomas; five pounds each to be put out to interest for their dispositive use until they arrive at the age of twenty one years.

Item I will and order that my Executors do cut a tombstone over my beloved wife's and my grave as soon as convenient after my decease.

Item I will and order that to pay my Just debts and legacies above bequeathed that my Executors hereinafter mentioned do put to sell all my Estate real and personal and empower them to ... my lands unto the purchase or purchasers as fully and lawfully as I could myself when Living and if

after paying the debts and Legacies there is a remainder they shall divide the same currency my Children share and share alike without respect to age or sex. Likewise I will and order that if any of my grandchildren above mentioned should die before they arrive at the age of Twenty One years that their Legacy shall go to their parents respectively.

Lastly I constitute ordain and appoint my beloved son, Andrew Gibson, Esqr.; and my son in law, James Criswell, my only Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and disannulling all other wills and Testaments heretofore by me made and all other Executors by me constituted and declaring this to be my only last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of April in the year of Our lord one thousand =  
Seven Hundred ninety and nine.

Be it Remembered that on the 7th day of Novr 1803 the last will and testament of Andrew Gibson late decd was proved in due form of law and Letters Testamentary were Granted to James Criswell one of the Exrs. therein named (the other Viz. Andrew Gibson Esqr being dec'd) he being duly sworn well and truly to Administer and being in an Inventory of the deceased estate into the registers appear on or before the 7th day of December next and settle the Acct. of his administration in a year or when thereunto legacies required given under the seal of sd ...

Family tradition is that Andrew came to the US with three brothers, according the a genealogy by Nancy (Gibson) Hess. According to Ms. Hess, Andrew also may have had a sister, Jane who stayed behind in Ireland. It is believed that other brother, possibly two, stayed in Pennsylvania and that the reminding brother moved to the south Virginia or West Virginia are. The family's ultimate origin was no doubt Scotland, but the settlement around Londonderry and West Fallowfield, Chester Co., Pennsylvania were clearly from Ireland, most of them being from County Derry.

Andrew might be the Andrew Gibson who appears in Birmingham Twp., Chester Co., Pennsylvania, in tax assessments from 1735 through 1740 and then again in 1751, although this person would seem more likely related to the Quaker, John Gibson, who appears there starting in 1740. This seems likely since Andrew Gibson appears in West Fallowfield Twp., Chester Co., starting in 1749 (the 1748 list is missing), as well as 1751. Perhaps records in New Castle Co., Delaware, may show evidence that Andrew Gibson lived there during this period. By his will dated 16 November 1747/8, Nicholas Jones, of Fallowfield, appointed Andrew Gibson adn Joseph Adams overseers of his will. Andrew Gibson was taxed on land holdings of between 150 to 210 acres between 1765 and 1780. Between 1784 and 1802, he sold land in five deeds to John Crosby, Thomas Gibson and William Criswell.

Notes for Margaret \_\_\_\_\_:

Although there is no evidence with which to identify her family, she may have been part of the family of Jacob Weldin, of New Castle Co., Delaware. This might account for the uncommon name "Jacob" being given to her eldest surviving son and why two of her children married children of Joseph Weldin of Brandywine Hundred, New Castle County, Delaware, which is some distance from western Chester County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for Jacob Gibson:

Jacob was living in 1799. He may have been the Jacob Gibson (1740-1815) who was in Fawn Township, York C., PA, by 1783, as he was the only man of that name living in Pennsylvania in 1800. This man, by his second wife, Annie Whiteford, has a son Andrew. The will of Jacob Caulk, of New Castle Co., DE, dated 1 February 1865, named his son-in-law, Jacob Gibson, executor.

Notes for Mary Gibson:

Mary never married. In her will dated 2 November 1819 and proved 3 February 1923, she left part of her estate to her niece, Rebecca Reed; her sister, Margaret Lyons; her sister, Jane Weldin; her sister, Agnes Criswell; and her sister, Sarah Criswell's three children: Jane, Margaret and Samuel Criswell. Her brother-in-law, Samuel Criswell was appointed executor.

**12. James<sup>3</sup> Gibson** (Alexander<sup>2</sup>, Unknown<sup>1</sup>) was born Abt. 1742, and died 1794 in Oxford Twp., Chester Co., PA. He married **Mary Kind** October 19, 1786.

Notes for James Gibson:

James appears in the tax lists first in 1763 as a freeman in West Fallowfield, PA. He married Mary Kind on 19 October 1786. This was probably his second marriage.

**16. George<sup>3</sup> Gibson** (Andrew<sup>2</sup>, Unknown<sup>1</sup>) died Bet. August 14 - November 13, 1819 in Upper Oxford Twp., Chester Co., PA. He married **(1) Elizabeth** \_\_\_\_\_ Bet. 1769 - 1771. She was born Abt. 1744, and died October 23, 1784. He married **(2) Eleanor Elliot** August 17, 1792. She was born Bet. 1765 - 1774 in of Octorar, Sadsbury Twp., Chester Co., PA or Lancaster Co., PA.

Notes for George Gibson:

George Gibson, listed with Alexander Gibson in the 1735 tax list of Londonderry, PA, and in subsequent lists there until 1740. He is not in the next list there (1748), but may be the George Gibson listed in 1751 in Birmingham, PA, although this is unlikely, because the Thoms Gibson who lived there was Quaker and probably from a different family. A George Gibson is said to be the father of Jacob Gibson (c1740-c1778), of West Fallowfield who married Margaret KcElhaney who had a son named Jacob, but since there is no record of the estate of George Gibson of Chester Co., PA. is seems likely he moved south. George appears on the tax lists for the first time in 1766, when he was listed as a freeman in West Fallowfield Twp., Chester Co., Pennsylvania. He was also listed in 1767, 1768 and 1769. In 1771 he was no longer a freeman, so he must have married by this year. He was taxed on 50 acres, on horse, one cow, and three sheep. His land holdings increased to 80 acres in 1774 and 100 acres in 1779. During the Revolutionary War he served as a private in Captain Dunn's Company of the Chester Co. Militia, and again in the 7th Company of Chester Co. Militia in 1780, and in 1781 in Captain Cochran's Company. He was a member of the presbytery of Fagg's Manor Presbyterian Church on 6 June 1782 and again on 4 March 1785, but does not appear in a list of members of the church in 1804. The 1784 tax list finds him in Londonderry Twp., as do the 1790 and 1800 censuses. In the latter year his household consisted of one male under 10, two males 16-21, one male over 45, one female under 10, and one female 26-45. In 1810, he was also in Londonderry Township, next to William Gibson, with one male 10-16, one male 16-26, one male over 45, two females under 10, three females 10-16, and one female 26-45. He and his wife sold land in 1796 to John Crosby, in 1801 to Allen Chandler, in 1802 to John Chambers, in 1807 to John Reece, in 1811 to John Ramsey, and in 1814 to William Gibson. George Gibson was appointed administrator of the estate of Thomas Beatty, of Chester County, on 20 February 1784. He and Rev. John E. Finley witnessed the will of John Hindman, of London Grove, on 21 August 1789.

Be it Remembered that I George Gibson of the Township of upper Oxford in the County of Chester being weak in body but in Sound mind and Memory taking into view the uncertainty of Human Life and the propriety of Setting my worldly affairs and as touching such Estate & god has been pleased to bless me with in this life, I give devise and dispose of the Same in the following

manner and form that is to Say, First it is my Will and I order that all my Just Debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate; Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Elinor Gibson her bed and bed Clothes the best Case of Drawers and the Large Dining Table --- Item, it is my Will and I order that my plantation thereon we now live shall be made use of by my family until my youngest Daughter Mary shall arrive at the age of twenty one one years which will in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, Item, it is my Will and I order that as Soon as my youngest Daughter Mary Gibson arrives at the age of twenty one years my Executors shall Dispose of my plantation at public Vandue hereby authorizing and Empowering them to make a good and Sufficient title for the Same to the purchasers Requiring them to receive of the purchasers the Sum, the same may be [Solfas], Item it is my Will and I further order that out of the money arising from the foregoing Sale, I give and bequeath to my six sons viz.

John, Andrew, Thomas, Jacob, George Washington, & William Gibson, and my Daughter Margaret Biggart the Sum of sixteen Dollars each to be paid at the end of one year after the Sale of the Land; Item I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Elinor Gibson one third part of the neat proceeds of my

Real Estate; to be at her Disposal During her natural life and at her Death to Will and Dispose of the Same as she thinks proper, Item, I give and bequeath to my other Children that is to Say Joseph Elliot Gibson, Agness Gibson the remaining two thirds of the proceeds of my Real estate each Share and Share alike; --- Item it is my will and I

do order that my Son Joseph Elliot Gibson have and Receive out of the proceeds of my real Estate before any division is made the [sum] of one hundred dollars with one bed. Item I further give and bequeath to my two daughters, Agness, & Mary Gibson each the bed that they claim as their own proper right together with Them Necessary bedding; ---- Lastly, I do hereby Constitute and appoint William Gibson & Joseph Elliot Gibson to be Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and Disannulling all other wills by me heretofore made Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last will and testament

Notes for John Gibson:

The will of Isabel Ramsey, of Londonderry Township, Chester County, dated 9 October 1787, proved 29 May 1788, gives property to George Washington Gibson at the age of 21, with reversion to his "elder" brother John Gibson, sons of George Gibson. In 1819, John Gibson, through an attorney, sold land to William Townsend and others.

30 iii. Jacob Gibson, died Aft. 1819.

Notes for Jacob Gibson:

Although descendants believe him to be the son of Jacob and Margaret (McElhaney) Gibson and the grandson of George Gibson, the senior Jacob does not appear in records of West Fallowfield, where the younger Jacob Gibson lived. This person, born about 1776, died 1 August 1843 in West Fallowfield Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania. He married Jane Elizabeth Brush, born 21 February 1781 in

County Antrim, Ireland, died 20 October 1855 near Steelville, Chester County, Pennsylvania. This Jacob Gibson had ten children.

**18. Andrew<sup>3</sup> Gibson** (Andrew<sup>2</sup>, Unknown<sup>1</sup>) was born Abt. 1749, and died Bet. 1800 - 1803. He married **Hannah Weldin**, daughter of Joseph Weldin and Margaret Robinson. She died in of New Castle Co., CE.

Notes for Andrew Gibson:

Andrew lived in Brandywine Hundred, New Castle Co., Delaware in 1800. In 1778 he (next to Jacob Weldin) signed an oath of allegiance to the state of Delaware. In 1782, we was in Brandywine Hundred with three males over 18, two females over 18, two males under 18, and one female under 18. The will of George Robinson, farmer, of Brandywine Hundred, dated 12 December 1784, named his "kinsman" Andrew Gibson as executor. As his father named him executor, he must have lived not far, and thus was, no doubt, the Andrew Gibson, "Esq.," living in Brandywine Hundred, New Castle Co., Delaware, in 1800.

William Lyon was born on the fifteenth day of November 1755 in the Parish of Ballyrashane, County Derry, Northern Ireland. He left Ireland in 1772 bringing with him the family bible, which eventually became lost during his movements in America.

He is listed as an indentured contract boy in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to Stephen Shewell for a period of one year. There are persistent stories that he was one of 2 to 4 brothers who migrated together, though in the immigration lists he is alone.

In August of 1776, while a resident of Leacock Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, William joined the Pennsylvania Militia as a private in Capt. Scott's Company, Col. James Crawford's Regiment for a 2 month enlistment. That term having expired he immediately reenlisted for another two months in Col. Klotz's Regiment

of the Second Battalion of the Lancaster County Flying Camp. He marched to Paulsboro on the day that the English took New York and on the same day a part of his regiment was ordered to Staten Island, New York to attack a place called Cocklestown. During a skirmish in which they took the first Hessian prisoners they discovered these were the first Hessians to be taken by Americans.

In November of 1776 William volunteered to go to Fort Washington and in a battle on the 16th or 17th of November received a musket ball in his right thigh. He was taken back to Ft. Lee, New Jersey to the hospital and eventually was dismissed from the hospital at Bethlehem, Pennsylvania in January of 1777.

Being "unable to labour as before", William Lyon went to West Fallowfield, West Chester, Pennsylvania to study shoemaking. According to his declaration for pension benefits, he was idle from January 1777 to September of 1779 when he volunteered for a naval enlistment on board the ship "Flora", commanded by Captain Down. They sailed to the West Indies returning to Philadelphia in July of 1780. Records from the Pennsylvania Archives have William Lyon serving with the Fourth Pennsylvania Regiment in Captain Fishbourne's Company in 1777 and in the Invalid Corps in 1778. If this record belongs to our William Lyon then one must speculate on its omission from his declaration for pension in the war.

The Fourth Pennsylvania was the "mutiny regiment" and they marched on the state house in Trenton, New Jersey, then on the legislature and Continental Congress in Philadelphia. All they wanted was clothing and back pay but unfortunately got nothing. A few were executed at Washington's insistence and the rest were punished by being sent to New York to fight the Indians in winter.

Returning to West Fallowfield in Chester County, Pennsylvania, William married Margaret Gibson, daughter of Andrew and Margaret Gibson of Chester County. This event probably took place between 1780 and 1781. In a list of residences given to the court as part of his declaration of service, William states that he moved from Chester County in 1784 to Cumberland County (later Mifflin), Pennsylvania. Thus began a long series of moves culminating in a final destination in Morgan County, Ohio in 1829.

William was awarded his veteran's 100 acres, then later sold the land in 1797 while a resident of Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania. The 1800 Census of Westmoreland County shows a William Lyons with 2 females and one male under 10, one male between 26 and 45 and one female between 16 and 26 years of age, the latter two being William and his wife. I believe this to be the Lyon's most likely to be our ancestor.

On a tax list for Belmont County, Ohio, William appears next in 1810 along with sons Thomas and John. While a resident of Belmont County he purchased land in Range 11, Township 5, Section 19. William must have moved to Tuscarawas County by 1820 where he is counted in the census of Dohrman Township along with son, Thomas, age 31 and George, about 20.

In 1824, son John, as a resident of Belmont County, purchased lands in Morgan County, Ohio in Range 9, Township 4. In 1829, son Thomas, while a resident of Tuscarawas County, Ohio, purchased land in Range 9, Township 6, Section 18 which he and his wife Menie Lowrie later sold to his brother, George Lyon(s). In 1832 son John, by then a resident of Morgan County, Ohio, purchased land in Range 9, Township 6, Section 6 just north of the town of Sharon, Ohio which was established in 1830. It should be noted that during the early years of land sales, taxes were not collected until 5 years after the initial land purchase.

In the 1830 Census of Morgan County, Ohio, William is not listed as head of household. He and his wife are probably living with son John in Olive Township. They were members of the Olive Presbyterian Church in 1831 and in 1832 they contributed money towards the building of a new Presbyterian Church in Sharon, Ohio.

William applied for his Revolutionary War Pension in 1832 and although it was awarded him he never collected on it due to his death. We have no record of his date of death but the Margaret Lyons who's death is recorded in the Sharon Presbyterian Church records (April 14, 1833) could very well be his wife.

The pursuit of William Lyon has been long and exhaustive with many hours spent in correspondence with other descendants, searches through court records and visits to the area where William and his descendants lived and were buried in and around Sharon, Noble County, Ohio. There are no records of birth, marriage or death but enough evidence in other public records to put together a chronology of his life. I believe William was a man of courage, determination, loyal to his adopted country and filled with a pioneering spirit rooted in his religious faith. We can be proud indeed to claim William Lyon our immigrant ancestor.

In 1820, Thomas was the head of a household in Freeport Township, Harrison County, Ohio, with two males under 10, one male 10-16, one male 16-25, one male over 45, two females under 10, four females 10-16, and one female 26-45. On 13 February 1829, Thomas Gibson bought from Thomas Lyons and his wife Irene, for \$100, 51 acres in the west side of the east quarter of the southwest quarter of section 20 in township 6, range 1 west, in Tuscarawas County. In 1830, the family was in Rush Township, Tuscarawas County, Ohio, with one male 5-10, one male 70-80, and one female 60-70.

On 5 August 1837, Thomas Gibson took out a U.S. patent on the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of

section 24, in township 6, range 1 west, consisting of 40 acres, but on 24 February 1845, he and his wife Jane sold it to David Gibson, for \$100.

By his will, dated 16 September 1864, proved 20 June 1866, Thomas Gibson gave two his sons George and David each one dollar, in addition to what they had already received. He gave one dollar each to his daughters Elizabeth Huff, to the heirs of his daughter Isabell Kennedy, and to the heirs of his daughter Jane Martin. He gave \$50 to his daughter Tabitha Orr, to be paid by his executor four years after his death. He gave to his daughter Margaret Johnson the farm on which he lived, as well as whatever stock he owned, farming utensils, grain, furniture and household goods. He appointed Margaret Johnson executrix of his will. Thomas Gibson signed by mark; the will was witnessed by John Schooly and Samuel G. Kennedy.

Rev. Oliver Perry Crawford, one of Elgin's pioneers, was born in Indiana, December 17, 1818. He is a son of Joseph Crawford, who ran a flatboat on the Ohio and Mississippi rivers. O. P. Crawford was reared in Indiana, and married Mary Ann Gibson, February 27, 1838. Mrs. Crawford was born in Brandywine Hundred, Delaware, January 29, 1817, and her parents, Joseph and Nancy Gibson, were also natives of that state. Mr. Crawford was the owner of a farm in Indiana, built and operated a mill, and practiced medicine. He arrived in Elgin on the 30th of June, 1857, and settled on section 8. At this time he was a local preacher of the M. E. faith, and often conducted religious services at his house and at various points in the vicinity. Besides giving his own services gratuitously he was a liberal supporter of the itinerancy. He was an Abolition Republican, and served several years as town supervisor, and also as county commissioner. He enlisted in the third Minnesota regiment, but was rejected from service on account of physical disability. His present home is in Iowa, where he is an itinerant preacher of the Free Methodist church. Of his thirteen children, all but four are living, as follows: Russell Martin, Brookings, Dakota; Andrew G., Atlantic, Iowa; Sarah J. (Mrs. William Quigley), Big Lake, Wisconsin; Nancy T. (Morrison), Monroe, Iowa; Henry B., New Sharon, Iowa; Oliver P., Kansas; Mary A., with parents; Francis Edward, New Sharon, Iowa. 1336

Oliver's Pension Records say that he was 6' tall, dark complexion, grey eyes, and dark hair. [200] By 1881 his hair had turned silver. Oliver married Mary Ann, who lived with her brother, Andrew Gibson, 2 farms away from Oliver's brother, James W. Mary Ann had moved to Ohio in 1835 and then on to Indiana in 1837. In 1845 after

Andrew Gibson died, Oliver is listed as the guardian of Andrew's children, Elizabeth and Thomas Gibson. These children moved out of Indiana in 1849 to live with other relatives. Thomas Gibson moved back with Oliver by 1860 and served in the Minnesota Artillery when he fell ill and died in Illinois, a short time after marrying.

By 1850, Oliver had continued building a farm and family. But by 1857 he was ready to move west along with several of his brothers and sisters. While property records for Wabasha, Minnesota indicate that Oliver bought farmland on May 25, 1858, the 1860 and 1870 census information indicates that Oliver still lived in Indiana in 1856. Census and ME Church records show that Oliver's sister, Artemesia, and her husband, George Sheeks, moved to Minnesota as well as Oliver's brother George (ME Minister). Oliver's older brother, Elijah Harvey, moved to Mercer Co, Missouri in 1846 and then across the border to Decatur Co, IA in 1851. He later met up with the other family members in Iowa in the late 1860's when they moved to Iowa.

The 1860 census indicates that Oliver lived in Elgin, Minnesota as a Methodist clergyman, just 6 houses away from Moses Barton. Wabasha property records indicate the Crawford family was involved with a myriad of property transactions including Sheriff's Sales, US gov't property sales, sales to the School District, intra-family sales and private sales. Oliver's son, Russell, bought farmland in 1860 and in 1862 Russell bought property from his mother. By 1866, Oliver's second son began to buy farmland after returning from service in the Civil War. Records show Oliver owned property in adjacent Winona Co. as well.

Civil War records show that Oliver volunteered for military service at age 43 on 15 Aug 1862. Oliver was mustered on 2 Sep 1862 at Fort Snelling in St. Paul, MN. After entering as a Sergeant in Company C of the 10th Minnesota Infantry he received injuries during training on 10 Oct 1862. He was disqualified for medical reasons and discharged on 19 Jan 1863.

Oliver moved from Elgin to New Sharon, Mahaska, Iowa in Oct 1867 and he purchased property on 15 Feb 1868 and recorded the transaction on March 30. But he continued to sell his remaining property in Minnesota until 1875. Oliver's sons, Russell and Joseph, stayed in Minnesota with Russell's family to look after Oliver's property. Oliver's son, Andrew, moved to Iowa with Oliver in 1868 and purchased property on 23 Aug and recorded on 2 Sep.

Oliver moved to Minnesota in 1857 and to Iowa in 1867, and that he served as a Methodist-Episcopal preacher with Hiram Allen in Iowa. [420] Oliver and Hiram's paths first crossed when they both lived in Elgin. Hiram's son, Albert W. served with Oliver's son, Andrew, in the 1st Independent Battery Minnesota Light Artillery and after the War Albert married Oliver's daughter Nancy T. and settled in Sharon, Mahaska Co, Iowa. At first indication, it looks like the Allens who were from New York and Vermont, were related to Amy Allen, wife of Moses Barton, whose daughter married Oliver's son Andrew. Apparently Albert and Nancy divorced since Albert appears in the 1880 census living in Kansas with another wife. Aunt Nancy was remembered by family members as living into the 1900's.

While several of Oliver's sons stayed in the Mahaska area, Oliver apparently left his property to his sons while he travelled as a preacher on the Iowa circuit. Son, Oliver P., was a produce retailer in Sharon. Son, Henry Bascom, operated a hotel in Mt. Pleasant, Iowa. And son, Frank, remained in Sharon until after 1900 as a farmer but eventually moved to Pasadena, California where he owned a fruit orchard.

In Sep 1872 Oliver moved to Pleasantville, Iowa, in Sep 1873 to Palo, Iowa, in May 1875 to Birmingham, Iowa, in Sep 1875 to Waterloo, Iowa, in May 1876 back to Elgin, Minnesota, in Feb 1877 to Aurora, Illinois, and in Sep 1877 to Marengo, Illinois. A personal letter dated February, 1878 from Oliver to his son, Andrew, in Atlantic, Iowa said that he was in Marengo, Illinois. Oliver, wife and youngest daughter were all sick but on the mend and would be moving to Atlantic in October. Oliver suffered from a hernia on his right side and varicose veins in both legs below the knees. Oliver took interest in medicine and treated himself and his family for most ailments.

In Sep 1878 he moved to Marengo, Missouri, in March 1879 to Covert, Kansas, in Aug 1880 back to New Sharon, Iowa, in May 1882 to Marion, Iowa and to Conrad Grove, Grundy, Iowa before 1886 when his wife, Mary Ann, died. Oliver, his wife, youngest daughter Mary Ann, and granddaughter Jennie are shown in the 1885 Iowa census living on a farm near Conrad Grove. Mary Ann was a music teacher and Jennie was a school teacher.

By 1889 he moved to Radcliffe, Hardin, Iowa where he remained until his death in 1899. Oliver was married a second time to Mary Sybert by Rev. George Patrick in Radcliffe. ] Oliver was buried next to Mary Ann Gibson in

Conrad Grove.

Andrew's army pension records show that he was 5'8" tall, light complexion, hazel eyes and light hair. Andrew married Maria Antoinette in Rochester, Minnesota by Ezra Tucker in the presence of D.R. Culzer and Charlotte Lathrop. 1860 Census records indicate that Andrew was a member of both the Oliver P. Crawford household as well as the Moses Bradford Barton household 6 houses away in the Forest Mound Post Office District near Elgin, Wabasha, Minnesota.

Andrew volunteered and was mustered 4 Jan 1864 at Ft. Snelling (St. Paul, MN) into the 1st Independent Battery of the Minnesota Light Artillery, 1st Division, 17th Army Corps, Army of the Tennessee and served under General Sherman beginning in February 1864 at the Battle of the Big Black River in Mississippi. Andrew's correspondence with his family during this time is available. During this time, Maria lived near the historic post office called Forest Mound (1857-74) in Elgin. For most of the War, Andrew tented with his cousin E.H. Sheeks. Also serving in the Battery were Andrew's future brother-in-law Albert Allen and two other cousins, Bill Sheeks and Thomas Gibson (d Feb 1864).

The 1st Battery secured the rail bridge over the Big Black between Vicksburg and Jackson while Sherman's armies marched to Meridian, MS. After Big Black, the Battery was transferred first to Cairo, IL, then to Clifton, TN, then to Decatur and Huntsville, AL, then to Rome and Kingston, GA in April 1864. The Battery rejoined the main force at Acworth, GA and served under General McPherson's command on the left flank of Sherman's forces in the Atlanta Campaign along with the Army of the Cumberland (center) and the Army of the Ohio (right). Intense battles followed at Kennesaw Mountain, Nickajack Creek, Howell's Ferry, the Chattahoochie River, and Leggett's Hill.

The Atlanta Campaign intensified to the Siege of Atlanta when Sherman's armies surrounded the city. The 17th Corps was shifted to the east of the city at Ezra Chaple near Decatur where the Army rebuffed Gen'l Hood's second sortie when Gen. McPherson was mortally wounded. Gen. Howard took command of the 17th Corps and then flanking moved to the south of the city at East Point and then to Jonesboro to cut rail links. The Corps moved to Lovejoy Station and Atlanta finally fell in Sep 1864. Through October the Army operated in North Georgia and Mississippi against Hood. Andrew was present for every unit roll call except for 31 Oct 1864 when he left with a detachment in charge of Lt. John D. Ross for Atlanta.

The 17th Corps served on the right flank on Sherman's March to the Sea. Gen Howard commanded the right flank with the 17th Corps commanded by Gen. Frank Blair. The 1st Battery was shifted to the 4th Division at the beginning of the March. Savannah was captured at Christmas 1864. The March through the Carolinas saw struggles through the coastal swamps in the rainy months of January and February, the cities of Orangeburg and Columbia burn at the hands of locals who were destroying warehouse reserves of tobacco (Orangeburg) and bales of cotton (Columbia). The march continued through Winnsboro toward Cheraw, SC and Fayetteville, NC. An intense battle followed at Bentonville before finally meeting with additional armies at Goldsboro, NC. When the war drew to a close, Sherman negotiated a generous surrender with Johnston's army at Raleigh, NC. The Army of the Tennessee marched in the Grand Review of Union Troops on the second day, May 24, behind, Gen. Sherman. The Battery returned to St Paul, MN on June 12. Andrew was discharged 30 June 1865 and arrived home on 1 July.

Andrew first worked as a farmer with both his father and his father-in-law. Real property records indicate that several purchases were made by both families in the Territory and State of Minnesota. [32] Andrew and his wife moved with his father's family to Iowa in 1867 where they purchased property in Sharon, Mahaska, Iowa. [23] Andrew claims to have lived in Illinois and Tennessee which may have occurred between 1866 and 1878. [201] His 1870 census record has not yet been found.

Maria's parents moved from Minnesota to near Anita, Cass, Iowa in 1872. Andrew trained as a carpenter while assisting both sets of parents in farming and several land purchases in both counties. Andrew and Maria moved to

Benton Township, Cass County to be close to Maria's parents and because Andrew's father began traveling on the Iowa Circuit as a Methodist Episcopal preacher. Andrew claims to have lived in Missouri and Kansas which probably occurred between Sep 1878 and May 1882 when his father was working in those states. His 1880 census record has not yet been found.

Andrew's family appears in the 1885 Iowa State census residing in Grant Twp, Cass Co. [227] His daughter, Jennie is residing in Conrad Grove in Grundy Co with Andrew's father and is shown in the 1885 census to be a school teacher. Andrew sold his property in Cass Co in 1886 and moved very near to Conrad Grove in Liscomb, Marshall Co. Andrew applied 16 Aug 1890 from Lake Mills, Wisconsin, where his oldest son lived, for disability benefits under his army pension. Pension records say that Andrew was blind in the left eye, lame, and suffering from a hernia.

It was reported in the local newspaper in June of 1893 Andrew was building a house in Conrad and that in July 1896, he sold his house and moved to California. [422] In 1897 property records show that Andrew began buying and developing residential property in Iowa Falls, Hardin Co. The 1900 census shows the family living in Iowa Falls at 107 Bliss Blvd. [220]

But by 1901, after the death of Andrew's father, the family began selling all property in Iowa to move to Pasadena, California for health reasons. Letters from Charley on a gold mining expedition in Sonora, Mexico to his parents in 1902 exist. By 1910, Andrew owned his own home at 381 Waldo Ave, Pasadena with no mortgage and was retired with an independent income. They had 5 children with 4 currently living. Some of Andrew's carpentry tools still exist.

After Andrew died, Maria continued to live at 381 Waldo Ave in Pasadena and applied for Veteran Widow's benefits on June 19. The 1920 census shows that Maria had two Australian citizens, Niel R. and Charlott M. Stephens boarding in her house. Sometime before 1926, Maria moved to 337 North Minter Ave to live with her youngest son, John.

He was selected the all round athlete because he participated in so many sports. He learned to play golf at this time and the first year was a scratch player. After graduating from the Indiana Medical School, he did his internship at Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis. The interns got to ride the ambulances at the time of the Indy 500 and he especially liked to talk about this.

While in Indianapolis he met and married Beulah Irene Gibson who worked in a bank there. Dr. and Mrs. Acre moved to Evansville in the early 1920's where he began his practice of urology. They at first lived on Cherry Street and then the Donaldson Arms. Later they moved to the Colonial Apartments. Their daughter, Joan, was born in 1929. Another daughter had earlier died at childbirth.

From the Colonial Apartments they moved on Taylor Avenue and then to Runnymede. In the early 1940's the Acres bought a lovely two story brick home at 2311 Lincoln Avenue. The first ranch was destroyed by fire in the 1920's. The ranch was sold during WWII to pay back taxes and debts incurred by the overseer who had replaced the Japanese caretaker lost to the labor camps. By 1985 the ranch was named Clack Ranch where thoroughbred horses were raised.

In Utah, Paul met his future wife and they were married in 1942 just before Paul was mustered into military service in Dec 1942 at Fort MacArthur. Paul trained in the 14th Armoured Division (Tank Corps) at Camp Smith, Arkansas and was transferred to the artillery and served in the 62nd Field Artillery Battalion in the North Africa Campaign, Sicily Invasion, D-Day on Omaha Beach in Normandy, St. Lo Breakthrough, Battle of the Bulge, and finally in the Army of Occupation in Pilsen, Czechoslovakia. A detailed unit record has been published using the unit log to which Paul contributed during the war. Late in the war Paul met with a survivor of the 14th Armoured Division who told him the unit was almost completely destroyed at St. Lo.
