Notes for Thomas Samuel Harlan:

Thomas Samuel was born at the home of his father. Thomas S. was a planter and farmer. The home place was said to have been named Glendower and sold by James White for Confederate money. It is still standing and is in use in Glendower, Va. at this time (1954). The house is dark red brick with double colonial porches at each end. The records of the sale of the place were destroyed when the courthouse at Scottsville burned to the ground. At one time there were 1800 or more acres of land and they owned 300 slaves. I have heard my grandfather (written by Elizabeth Strickler) John Bailey say that his father and grandfather would never sell a slave unless at the slave's request. The case being that he wanted to marry a slave woman owed by someone else who would not sell her. I have heard my grandfather say that only about three slaves were willing to leave the family after the Civil War, but of course they no longer had the money to take care of them, as the money they had was Confederate. The place that they moved to after leaving Glendower was called Meadowbrook and burned to the ground leaving them nothing. I have heard John Bailey speak of being terribly hungry while playing with thousand dollar bills along with his brothers. He recalled along this time of there coming a day when there was nothing in the house to eat at all and of he and his brothers trying to eat some soap. The commissary later that day gave them the last small ration of meal that would be issued. The family of Thomas S. then moved to West Virginia (Bath County) where they resided until 1881 when they moved to Henry County, Kentucky on a farm between Ghent and Warsaw. In the latter years of his life he and his wife, Mary Fleming, lived at La Grange, Kentucky, in the house where his son Edgar Leslie Harlan later lived. His wife, Mary Fleming, was his first cousin once removed.

Thomas fought on the Confederate side in the Civil War. He enlisted in the C Company, 19th Infantry Regiment, Virginia on April 17, 1861 in Scottsville, VA.

J. F. Harlan's Unusual Professions

Editor's Note: The following is a compilation of information from two biographical sketches written by John B. Harlan, subject of the story titled "John Bailey Harlan Was Shrewd Detective" on page 8 of the Spring 2004 Harlan Record. Juanita Creighton, of Richmond, Va., submitted the detective piece and the two sketches compiled here. John B. Harlan was the brother of her grandfather, Howard Hinton Harlan (7956iii).

One of our Harlan cousins, James Forbes Harlan (#7956i), had some unusual professions. His brother, L&N Railroad detective John B. Harlan (#7956v), provided the following information.

Born in Albemarle County, Va., on July 12, 1851, James moved with his family shortly after the Civil War to Mountain Grove, Bath County, Va., where they resided in a cabin on property owned by Colonel A.C.L. Gatewood, of Confederate fame. The farm was situated at the fork of Little Back Creek and Big Back Creek.

"Mountain Grove was a little scattering village consisting of a Post Office, Blacksmith and Wheelwright shop, and a Manufacturing Mill belonging to old Colonel Gatewood," brother John recalled. It was located with Warm Spring Mountain to the east and the Allegheny Mountains to the west. "The little valley stretched up Big Back Creek perhaps eight or ten miles and ranged from two hundred and fifty feet to half a mile in width. In that section at that time, the mountains abounded with game, bear, deer, wolves, wild cats, panthers, catamount, wild turkey, pheasants, and in fact all manner of game, and our chief occupation while in that section was hunting, trapping, and fishing," John wrote.

In 1873 or '74, the family moved to Greenbrier County, crossing the Allegheny Mountains in ox carts. They lived for about a year on Captain William Reed's farm, about a mile and a half northwest of Frankfort. They then lived for three years on the Lewis Creigh farm, then moved to Monroe County, to a section known as Swopes Knobs in the mountains near Johnson's Cross Roads, about 15 miles from union. Later the family moved to Henry County, Ky.

During the years that James lived in Greenbrier and Monroe counties, he worked most of the time as a "professional hacker of brush" on the mountains near Cranberry Glades in Pocahontas County, according to his brother.

"While so engaged he came in contact with a Professor of Music from Richmond, Va., L.J. Whitt, who was also a Professor of Penmanship," John continued, "and the two became very much interested in each other, and Professor Whitt induced Mr. Harlan to travel with him and give music lessons and also take lessons in penmanship from him. They traveled together for two years or more, making quite a success in their profession. After Professor Whitt had returned to Richmond from West Virginia, Mr. Harlan took up his profession of teaching penmanship as well as giving music lessons on banjo and violin, more especially on the banjo." James became well known by traveling around to the crossroads school houses and teaching music and penmanship.

James Harlan's first banjo was a large gourd strung with horse hair, made for him by his grandfather's, servant, known as Uncle Lewis, who drove the family carriage.

"After young Harlan got so he could strike a few tunes, there was a young lady in the neighborhood, Miss Mollie Clark, who took an interest in him, and being a good performer on the banjo herself, she taught him all the fundamental principles that she knew concerning banjo picking," John wrote.

He was considered a "very great entertainer," according to his brother, who added, "Young Harlan was always ready to play for the old fashion dances or help entertain the youngsters in the several communities in which he lived, but never charged anything for this service. It was always rendered cheerfully. However, he made a nominal charge for lessons in penmanship and music."

The family moved to Henry County, Ky, near New Castle, in 1881. In Kentucky, James Harlan continued to teach music and penmanship for a number of years, teaching in Indiana, Ohio, Arkansas, and Tennessee as well.

Around 1915, he began to work for the railroad in Alabama, Tennessee, and Kentucky. In 1927, the year John Harlan wrote his sketch, his brother was located in Covington, Ky., and had been working for the Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company for three years. He was planning to travel back to Virginia to participate in the Old Fiddler's Contest at Ronceverte.

Virginia and George Thompson were married in Virginia. He was a Confederate soldier who was wounded and taken into the home of James White Harlan to be nursed back to health. He fell in love with Tabby, as she was called, and they were married and went back to Tennessee. Later they moved to Kentucky where he died and is buried in Bowling Green, where they live in or around. When George Thompson died, Tobitha came to Anchorage, Kentucky to live with there daughter Katherine Thompson and her husband Ernest Corbin. When she died she was buried in the Valley of Rest at La Grange, Kentucky. The tombstone is no longer there, but she is in the same plot as Thomas Samuel Harlan.

The 1900 Warren Co., KY census indicates that Virginia had a total of 4 children, all of whom where living in 1900.

This deed is noteworthy also from a memorandum inscribed on it in 1788, showing that it had been previously recorded, but the record had been destroyed by the British in 1781. GOOLSBY.

Thomas Goolsby was one of the earliest settlers within the present bounds of the county. In 1732, thirteen years before its organization, he patented twelve hundred acres on James River. In 1745 he sold more than five hundred acres to Samuel Shelton, and in the description of the deed are mentioned two tributaries of the James, called Holmans and Goolsby's Creeks. This deed is noteworthy also from a memorandum inscribed on it in 1788, showing that it had been previously recorded, but the record had been destroyed by the British in 1781. Thomas Goolsby died in 1774. He was twice married, his last wife being Lucy Bryant. His children were William, Thomas, Susan, the wife of a Childress, Ann, the wife of a Nowling, Lucy, the wife of a Saunders, and Elizabeth. William owned land on the waters of the south fork of Hardware. He died in 1819, and his children were William, Tabitha, the wife of Joseph Harlan, Tarleton, who married Mildred, daughter of Thomas Walker Jr., Sarah, the wife of a Thurmond, Susan, the wife of a Davis, Fleming, Jane, the wife of Samuel Harlan, Arthur, Mary, the wife of a Samuel Richardson, and Nancy, the wife of a Phillips.

Charles, James and John Goolsby, of Albemarle, were Revolutionary soldiers, members of the Ninth Virginia Regiment. Charles, who was a non-commissioned officer, and James were taken prisoners at Germantown; all three died in the service. They were beyond doubt sons of Thomas Sr., as William was stated to be their heir.

On a deed from Thomas Goolsby to Samuel Shelton dated July 1745, the following memorandum was inscribed: "February Court, 1788. This Indenture was produced to the Court, and it appearing from a certificate on the same, that it had been formerly recorded in this Court, the record whereof was destroyed by the British in the year 1781, on motion of Samuel Shelton it was ordered by the Court that it be recorded again, in pursuance of an act of Assembly for that purpose." The act here referred to may be found in Hening XII, 497.

Samuel Shelton was settled in the county from the beginning. In 1745 he purchased five hundred and fifty acres of the twelve hundred acre tract on James River, granted to Thomas Goolsby in 1732; the endorsement on the conveyance of this land made in 1788, expressly mentions the destruction of the records by the British in 1781.

In 1732 were made eight grants, still confined to the James River, and the western base of the South West Mountain. One of these was made to Thomas Goolsby for twelve hundred acres "on the north side of the Fluvanna," that is, the James; another in the same region to Edward Scott for five hundred and fifty acres "at a place called Totier;" another for four hundred acres to John Key, the head of a family which subsequently owned all the land between the South West Mountain and the river from Edgemont to the bend below the Free Bridge; and another to Dr. Arthur Hopkins for four hundred acres "on the south side of the Rivanna, running to the mouth of a creek below Red Bank Falls, called Lewis' Creek." This last entry included the site of the future town of Milton.

Michael and his brother George were yeoman farmers typically looking for better land. They were, or became Quakers and migrated to northern Ireland, presumably as part of the Anglo-Scottish "colonization" of that troubled area begun by Oliver Cromwell. They moved to the New World after George's marriage and settled in Pennsylvania in Chester Co. about 1687. (John Marshall Harlan, by LP Beth)

Michael, a "yeoman, Friend", was born "Nigh Durham, in Bishoprick, England, about the year 1660," and in early life emigrated with his brothers into Ireland and settled with them in the County of Down. Here he remained until 1687, when he accompanied his brother George to America. "And ye beginning of ye yeare 1690," Michael Harlan m. Joel Baily is supposed to have come from Wiltshire, England. One among the early purchasers of land in the Province of Pennsylvania was a Daniel Baily, who resided in Westbrook, in the parish of Bromham, Wiltshire. He was by trade and occupation a weaver, and in 1681 purchased a warrant for 125 acres of land in the Colony of William Penn, which was subsequently located in Birmingham Township, Chester County. He never came to America, but one Joel Baily, who was probably a near relative of his, appears to have been concerned in the sale of this land in 1713 to one William Radley. Joel Baily and Ann Short were married in Chester County, and resided on lands which were partly in Middletown and partly in Aston (now in Delaware County). in 1704/5 he removed to Marleborough, and afterwards into West Marlborough where he died in 1732.
