Samuel B. Robertson, a leading farmer in McLean County, KY., was born May 28, 1824, in Nelson County, KY., and is the seventh of twelve children, seven of whom are now living, born to William N. and Amelia (Overton) Robertson, natives of Nelson and Washington Counties, respectively. His grandparents (Robertson) came from Virginia to Nelson County in a very early day. His grandfather, Overton, was born in Virginia and was a soldier in the war of 1812, and was in the battle of New Orleans. Samuel B., (the subject) was reared on a farm. He came with his parents to Davies County, now McLean, in 1827, and lived with his parents until his marriage on December 24, 1846, to Mary J. Jackson, of McLean County; she was born in Ohio County, and is a daughter of George C. and Sarah (Landrum) Jackson. The fruit of this union is two children: George W., living, and James R., deceased. His wife died November 27, 1849, and he next married, January 8, 1852, Frances M. Morgan, of Daviess County, a daughter of Thomas T. and Margaret (Phegly) Morgan, natives of Virginia and Nelson County, Ky. Thomas T. Morgan was a son of John Morgan who came from Virginia to Ohio County, KY., in a very early day, as was killed by Indians about two years after his settlement in the county. Mr. Robertson has had born ten children, Mary T. (Bohannon), Horace L., Charles R., Virginia E., and Warren K., Albert B. Margaret F. (Short), Susan E., Mizelia M., and Edward G. Mr. and Mrs. Robertson are members of the Baptist Church. After his marriage, Mr. Robertson located where he now resides (in 1846), on 113 acres of land; he at present owns 216 acres in good condition, and with a fine residence on it. He was a justice of the peace for ten years; he is a member of the Masonic fraternity, and a Democrat in politics.

JOHN WESLEY TYLER GIVENS: This eminent pastor and denominational leader was born near Glenville, Daviess County, Kentucky, on January 22, 1870, and is a direct descendent of Captain George Givens who emigrated from Virginia to Kentucky after the Revolutionary War to take a tract of land in Lincoln County, Kentucky, given him for "valiant services" during that war. His mother and father were Phoebe Ann Tyler and Joseph Simpson Givens. After attending the schools at Glenville from 1876 to 1887, he attended Bethel College, Russellville, Kentucky, where he graduated with the A.B. Degree in the year 1893. From there he went to the Southern Baptist theological Seminary and took the English Course.

He was married to Miss Myzella May Robertson of Cleopatra, McLean County, Kentucky, on September 19, 1895. One son and one daughter blessed this union. The son, Edwin Tyler, died in 1928. The daughter, Mabel Grace, is still living and is married.

Bro. Givens was converted at an early age and was baptized into the fellowship of the Glenville Baptist Church by Elder A. G. Davis. He was licensed to preach by this Church on August 24, 1887, and was ordained on December 28, 1888, by the same Church. We are uninformed as to the names of the ministers who composed the ordaining council.

From first to last he has served the following Churches during his ministry of over fifty years:

Green River, 1891-1893; Whitaker's Grove, 1894; Milton, 1894; White's Run, 1895-1896; Worthville 1895-1896; Elloree, S. C., 1897-1898; Corinth, S. C., 1897-1898; Walnut Street, Owensboro, Kentucky, 1898-1900; Salem, Hopkinsville, Kentucky, 1900-1904; Washington Avenue, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, 1904-1905; Princeton, Missouri, First, 1905-1907; Joplin, Missouri, Second, 1907-1911; Carthage, Missouri, First, 1911-1915; Greenville, Kentucky, 1915-1917; Princeton, Kentucky, First, 1917-1921; Slater, Missouri, First, 1921-1923; Marion, Kentucky, First, 1924-1927; Greenwood, Bowling Green, Kentucky, 1927-1940; Morgantown, Butler County, 1931-1940; Burton Memorial, Warren County, 1927-1929.

About the middle of the year 1940 he became the Missionary of the Ohio County Baptist Association and served in this capacity until the ill health of his wife caused him to resign the work. He now makes his home at Bowling Green, Kentucky, and fills the pulpits of fellow pastors occasionally as a supply.

Brother Givens served as Trustee of the Oklahoma Baptist College, Blackwell, Oklahoma, in 1894-1895; as a Trustee of Bethel College, Russellville, Kentucky, in 1923-1924; as President of the Trolley League Ministerial Association of Southwest Missouri, in 1914-1915; as clerk of the Warren County Baptist Association in Kentucky, in 1930-1934. He also served on the State Mission Boards of Kentucky and Missouri Baptists in 1931-1934 and 1912-1914 respectively.

During his active ministry he has baptized over 1,750 persons into the fellowship of the Churches he has served and held revival meetings with other pastors in which over 1,500 were baptized. For one year

he served as an evangelist. He edited the "Walnut Street Evangel" in 1898, and labored in the publication of the "Green River Baptist" at the same time. He is the author of a tract "Evidences of Conversion" published in 1891. His poetical and hymn-writing ability has also been noted and one of his poems, "Albert Stone and Mabel Grace: A Legend of Love" is outstanding and was published in 1902. He has also written numerous articles for religious periodicals.

Even though he is now seventy-three years of age and has been in the ministry for almost fifty-five years, his activity in the cause of Christ is still unabated. Kentucky Baptists have been blessed by the life and labors of John Wesley Tyler Givens.

ANDREW BRIGGS was born September 20, 1853. His father, Thomas H. Briggs, was born in Nelson County, September 16, 1823. His wife was Miss Elizabeth McMakin. Their family consisted of four sons: Peyton, Andrew, John and Alexander, and one daughter, Katie. He has since attaining manhood followed farming with uniform success and has held office of magistrate of the county for over forty years. His father, Andrew Briggs, was a native of Edinburgh, Scotland. He came to the United States a short time after the Revolutionary war, and settled in Nelson County, of which county he became one of its most successful and extensive farmers. He was a true and consistent member of the Methodist Episcopal Church and died at the age of sixty-four in the year 1857. He was twice married, first to Miss Nancy Robinson, by whom he was the father of nine children; his next marriage was to Miss Mary Ferguson; to their union five children were born. Two of his sons were members of the Confederate Army. Peyton McMakin, maternal grandfather of our subject, was a native Kentuckian, born in Oldham County in the year 1800; he also became a very extensive farmer of Nelson County, and owned a large number of slaves. He married Miss Katie Bane and they reared a family of nine children; three of his sons fought on the Confederate side in the late war. In politics he was a staunch Democrat; he was a member of the Methodist Church. He died in 1864. Andrew Briggs, a native of Nelson County, has all his life followed the pursuits of the farm. His early education was good, partially obtained at Lynnwood College in Hardin County. His wife, whom he married September 19, 1878, was Miss Elizabeth Muir; they have only one child, a son named Elmo. Mr. Briggs devotes his entire attention to his vocation of farming and takes great interest in anything which will be to the advantage of his co-workers in that field; he is an active member of the Nelson County Agricultural Association, in which he holds the position of director, and is the proprietor of a fine, well improved farm of 166 acres, situated on the Bardstown and Bloomfield pike, about two and one-half miles from the latter place. He and his wife are members of the Presbyterian Church. His political views are Democratic.

CAPTAIN WILL NALL REVOLUTIONARY WAR SERVICE

Captain William Nall was captain of a company under the command of General Rutherford, General Arthur Campbell and Colonel Benjamin Cleveland. His son in law, Martin Gambill served under him "first as a sergeant, later insign and last as first lieutenant".

William Nall is listed as acting in the capacities of captain, major, lt. colonel and colonel, also as a justice of Virginia.

The above William Nall was born circa 1744 in Orange County Virginia, (probably a son of John Nalle and Mary Brown Nalle) is listed as dying sometime after December 1791, and living at that time in Woodfort County, Kentucky.

RELATING TO THE NALL (NALLE) FAMILY IN HARDIN COUNTY

From information supplied by Mr. C. Fuller Nall, the rest of the Nall line to whom the Hardin County line traces was one Martin Nalle, born about 1680, who married a Mary Alden. He was born in England and is reported as living and dying circa 1728 in Essex County, Virginia. They were parents of eight children, one of whom, John Nalle, married Mary Brown.

Before moving further along into this article it should be added that the earliest spellings of this family name were Nalle, and the spelling is familiar even today in some areas, notably in the Culpeper, Virginia section of the country, from which place many of the ancestors of the present Hardin County Nalls came. Nall, Nalle, and possibly Nalley are variations of the name. In England, the spelling was Nall.

John Nalle was born circa 1700 and died about 1782 (Culpeper records). He and Mary Brown Nalle were parents of twelve children: Richard, John, William, Francis, James, Agatha, Mary, Ann, Elizabeth, Gressel (Grizzel) Amie, and Martin.

The above James Nalle and Francis Nalle served in the Culpeper militia together, Francis being the company _____. The writer does not have information as to other sons of John and Mary Brown Nalle serving in the military.

Land Office records show one James Nall entering 500 acres of land May 25, 1780, located on the Beech Fork watercourse; Martin Nall entered the following: 1,000 acres May 17, 1780 on Rolling Fork, and a second entry also on Rolling Fork; 50 acres June 2, 1780, on Ohio River watercourse, Mil.; another 400 acres on Ohio River on June 21, 1780; 400 acres on Salt River the same date; on March 20, 1781 another 1,000 acres and on December 16, 1783, 2,000 acres on Salt River, Mil. and surveyed.

A Richard Nall entered 307 acres May 25, 1780, located on Beech Fork watercourse and surveyed; 133 acres, the same date and location and on April 15, 1784, 40 acres on Beech Fork, marked 133 surveyed returned.

William Nalle entered 500 acres June 2, 1780, Ohio River, and the same date 1,750 acres, located in Green River area. Francis Nalle entered 500 acres May 25, 780, near the Beech Fork and Salt River and surveyed; on December 28, 1782, 892 1/2 acres on Beech Fork.

The writer at this time has no supporting evidence to indicate that the above James, Martin, Richard, William and Francis Nalls were brothers and sons of John and Mary Brown Nalle. All entered lands in the same general era. It would be more than a coincidence if they were not. Nor would the writer know if the five above Nalls were in early Kentucky during the 1780's. These were pretty early dates in this part of the country. One Nall is related as having been with an exploring party in what is now Warren County in June, 1775.

James Nalle, son of John and Mary Brown Nalle, was born about 1745 in Culpeper County Virginia and died in March, 1814 in Nelson County, Kentucky. About 1769 in Culpeper County, Virginia, he married Elizabeth Kelly. Their children were: William, born October 25, 1770 in Virginia, died in Hardin County, Kentucky in 1837; John W. Nall, born in 1775, who married Maria Belinda Slack, Gruzza (Grizzel); Mary; Catherine; Martin; James N.; Richard; and Frances (Fanny) Nall, who married John N. Hill and lived to age 101 (she was one of triplet

children).

Nancy Ann Nall married John Batsel, Jr.; Eliza (Elizabeth) Nall married Robert Batsel. We may assume that Robert Batsel, John Batsel, Jr., and Susannah Batsel, who was William Nall's first wife, were children from the same family; it was common-place in pioneer days for several children from one family to marry several from a neighboring family.

With reference again to the land entered by the early-day Nalls and their likelihood of being in what is now Washington and Nelson Counties long before the end of the eighteenth century, there is support for some of them being located there at that period. The above William Nall, Sr., who was born in Virginia in 1770, apparently came to Kentucky with his father, James Nall, as on November 16, 1792, he married Susannah Batsel in Nelson County. She was born Jan 1, 1774 and died in 1810. On April 4, 1814, he next married Elizabeth Nall, a daughter of Martin Nalle, she being a cousin, the marriage taking place in Washington County.

Nalls whose descendents were prominent in Hardin County came originally from Virginia by way of early Jefferson, Nelson and Washington Counties; others possibly came directly to Hardin from homesteads in Virginia.

William Nall, Sr., and Susannah Batsel Nall (the "e" appears to have been dropped in the spelling of the name around 1800) were parents of ten children: James F. Nall, born September 13, 1793, died July 5, 1830, married Lucy Nalle; John, born May 8, 1785, married Mary Shelby on January 11, 1822; Elizabeth Nall, born February 8, 1797, married Thomas Farleigh, they were married January 16, 1842; Sarah (Sally), born October 28, 1798, Married John Shackelford, at one time operator of the old Eagle House, a hotel in Elizabethtown; she lived to the age of almost 102, dying in June, 1900; Susannah, born November 22, 1800, married Robert Phillips; Martin Nall, born September 5, 1802, died October 6, 1859, Married Elizabeth Nall, a cousin and the daughter of John and Belinda Slack Nall; she was born in 1805 and died in 1874; Robert Nall, born July 1, 1804, died April 6, 1876, married Elizabeth Holman, born in 1805, a daughter of Daniel and Sally Holman of Washington County, who had migrated to that place from Virginia and later moved to Hardin County; (above Martin and Robert Nall are buried in the Blue Ball Cemetery); Nathaniel Nall, born in 1806, who married first Polly Nall and second Frances Mariah Nall Newman; William Nall, Jr. born March 10, 1808, married Charlotte A. Stith, born February 15, 1815. They were married September 20, 1832. She was a daughter of the Reverend John (Jack) Stith and Lucy Ann Hardaway Stith. The Reverend Stith was born in Bedford County, Virginia, January 20, 1790, was married at age sixteen, came to Hardin County soon afterward and started preaching in this area. He is regarded as the founder of the Methodist Church in Elizabethtown.

Thomas B. Nall, born May 19, 1810 married Sarah (Sally) Nall; he later married Martha A. Hardaway.

Three children were born to William Nall, Sr.'s second marriage; Fanny Nall, born January 2, 1815, married Joshua Hobbs, their marriage taking place December 4, 1831; Mary (Polly) Nall born January 2, 1816, on September 12, 1837 married John H. Stith; Lewis Henry Nall, born January 15, 1819, died October 23, 1880, married Irena Rogers, born November 21, 1816, died March 23, 1892. Lewis Henry and Irena are buried in Otter Creek Cemetery.

William Nall, Sr., in 1828 purchased 850 acres of land from John L. Helm, grandson of Captain Thomas Helm, one of the original settlers of Elizabethtown. John L. Helm served as seventeenth and twenty-third governors of the state. The land purchased from Helm is located in the west central part of Hardin County and has since the settling of the Nall family in that section been known as Nall's Valley, and includes some of the most productive land in the county. Other branches of the Nall clan also settled in the Nall's Valled country. They appear to have been rather prolific; their large families and descendents added to the county population in large measure. An anecdote related by Mr. Fuller Nall based on a comment made by his father some years back was that in that part of the county when you might meet a stranger on horseback, you would address him as "Mr. Nall" and that nine times out of ten, the stranger would respond that he was indeed "Mr. Nall". Another anecdote is that at one time in the county's history, the Nalls accounted for fifth place in total family names in the entire county.

William Nall, Sr., accumulated a very large estate for his time. When he died in 1837, his estate of lands and personal property was distributed among his children and was sufficient to leave all of them rather wealthy.

William Nall, Jr., born 1808, died August 19, 1878 in Hardin County, and his wife Charlotte Stith Nall who died April 15, 1880, were parents of nine children. All born in Nall's Valley: Jack Stith Nall, born December 22,
