Obituary of Mary Elizabeth Tomlinson

Word was received in Indianapolis last night of the death of Mrs. Elizabeth Acre, 63 years old, wife of Robert H. Acre, former Indianapolis residents, which occurred at 6:00 p.m. Monday, July 21, 1930 at Enid, OK. Death followed complications of an appendicitis operation which was undergone several days ago.

Mr. Acre, a former member of the Indiana legislature and long active in Republican politics, moved to Enid with Mrs. Acre some months ago, joining there a son, Harry M. Acre, who is an extensive Oklahoma oil field operator. Three daughters of Mrs. Acre, Misses Ruby and Pauline Acre who are connected with the offices of the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce and Mrs. T.M. Hindman, all residing at 4331 Guilford Ave. were summoned

to Enid Sunday, but it was not believed that they reached the Mother's bedside before her death.

Other relatives beside the son in Enid and the daughters include Dr. R. R. Acre of Evansville, Jesse E. and Fred E., all sons, the latter two of Enid and one sister, Mrs. John McGaughey of New Bethel. Before removing to Oklahoma, the Acre family resided at 3737 Guilford Ave. Mrs. Acre was a native of Shoals in Martin County, IN. Funeral arrangements have not been completed. It is believed the body will be brought to Indianapolis for burial.

John stayed in Oklahoma and lived ear the Arpaho Indian reservation. Robert lived in the Oklahoma panhandle near Enid, Oklahoma with his daughter Ruby. Robert moved back to Indiana near current Fort Harrison where he lived prior to going to Oklahoma. Ruby stayed in Oklahoma were she died. He is buried in Crown Hill Cemetery, Indianapolis, Indiana, Section: 224, Lot: 445. Robert Hamilton Acre was a state representative from Marion County, Indiana.

Robert Hamilton Acre

Robert Hamilton Acre was the son of Ephraim and Margaret Elizabeth (Hamilton) Acre. He was a native of Martin Co., Indiana. Ephraim's brother, Joseph, married Margaret's sister, Caroline Cornelius Hamilton.

Robert and his brother John Thomas Acre went out to Oklahoma before the Cherokee Strip rush from Hennessey and lived with the Indians. He staked a homestead claim on a farm a mile north of Lahoma. John stayed in Oklahoma and lived near the Arapaho Indian reservation. A short time later, however, he returned to Indiana and engaged in business there. He also took an active part in political affairs for many years, having been selected twice to serve in the Indiana State legislature.

Robert returned in 1929 to live in the Oklahoma panhandle near Enid, Oklahoma with his daughter Ruby. He was engaged in real estate and oil and gas lease brokerage business. In this capacity he contacted and knew hundreds of farmers throughout northwest Oklahoma. Robert moved back to Indiana near current Fort Harrison where he lived prior to going to Oklahoma.

Ruby stayed in Oklahoma and eventually moved to Tyler, Smith Co. Texas, where she worked for her sister, Margaret Paulyne Acre who owned a dress shop. Neither Ruby nor Paulyne ever married.

Robert and Margaret's other children were Gertrude (died young), Jesse Cecil (lived in Dallas, Texas at the time of his father's death in 1947), Frederick Ephraim (apparently never married), Harry Miles (was married twice and had two daughters by his first marriage), Mabel Elizabeth (married Thomas Hindman and had one son), and Robert Ragel Acre (a doctor in Evansville, Indiana and Karen's grandfather.) Robert Hamilton is buried in Crown Hill Cemetery, Indianapolis, Indiana, Section: 224, Lot: 445. Robert Hamilton Acre was a state representative from Marion County, Indiana.

Mr. Acre was a member of the Methodist church.

Robert Ragle Acre was born in Shoals, Indiana, on August 9, 1896. When he was quite young, the family moved to Lawrence, Indiana, several miles east of Indianapolis. They lived on a farm that was later bought by the US government for Camp Atterbury. The Ragle middle name was for the doctor that

delivered him.

He attended Indiana University for his undergraduate work and was a Kappa Sigma. Hogie Carmichel, who was famous for writing Stardust, was a fraternity brother of his. He was selected the all round athlete because he participated in so many sports. He learned to play golf at this time and the first year was a scratch player. After graduating from the Indiana Medical School, he did his internship at Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis. The interns got to ride the ambulances at the time of the Indy 500 and he especially liked to talk about this.

While in Indianapolis he met and married Beulah Irene Gibson who worked in a bank there. Dr. and Mrs. Acre moved to Evansville in the early 1920's where he began his practice of urology. They at first lived on Cherry Street and then the Donaldson Arms. Later they moved to the Colonial Apartments. Their daughter, Joan, was born in 1929. Another daughter had earlier died at childbirth.

From the Colonial Apartments they moved on Taylor Avenue and then to Runnymede. In the early 1940's the Acres bought a lovely two story brick home at 2311 Lincoln Avenue. Dr. Acre loved to play golf and was city champion, country club champion and Indiana Medical Association champion many times. Dr. Acre's office for many years was in the Hulman Building until he bought land on Walnut Street and built his own office exactly the way he wanted it. This land was condemned by the city in order to build the civic center. This was a blow to Dr. Acre and he never got over it. He, however, did open an office on Outer Bellemeade and continued to practice until the late 1960's. In 1972 Dr. and Mrs. Acre moved to Owensboro, Kentucky, to be near their daughter. Dr. Acre died of a stroke at the Hermitage Manor on March 26, 1976 and is placed in the mausoleum at Oak Hill Cemetery in Evansville.

Later she worked in a bank in Indianapolis and met Dr. Acre during this time. Mrs. Acre did beautiful handwork and spent many hours rolling and whipping lace on finer linen. She was a member of the board of the Christian Home, a home for unwed mothers. She was on the Altar Guild at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Cansta was here favorite card game and she had several friends that she played with. Also Dr. and Mrs. Acre belonged to a poker club with several other doctors and their wives. In 1972 she moved to Owensboro to be with he daughter. She lived in two apartments before moving into her daughter's house 1987. She died at Mercy Hospital in Owensboro on October 30, 1990 and is in the mausoleum at Oak Hill Cemetery in Evansville.
