James A. Hicks, aged 76 years, well-known resident of Falmouth, died suddenly at his home on W. Shelby Ave., early Sunday morning, July 30, 1945.

He was the son of Jesse and Sarah Turner Hicks and was born Aug. 13, 1868. He united in early manhood with the Mt. Lystra Christian Church. He married Lena Turner on Oct. 2, 1890. This union was dissolved by death March 30, 1904. To this union were born four children, one of whom died in early infancy. Thomas Clark died Feb. 25, 1943. The two surviving are Roxie C. Hicks of Detroit, Mich., and Pearl Hicks Speers of Covington.

In 1906 he was married to Fannie K. Glenn of Falmouth, who survives. Also surviving are five grandchildren, Mrs. Lena Spears McLynn of California, Natalie Spears of Covington, Joseph Hicks Spears, who is serving in the Army in Yuma, Ariz., Bernard Spears of Covington and Jeanne Hicks of Niagara Falls, N. Y. He is also survived by three sisters and one brother, Mrs. Florence Chipman and Eliza Robinson of Williamstown, Elizabeth Callon and Alfred Hicks, both of Mexico, Mo., Mrs. Arthur Simpson of Lawrenceville, Ky., and a host of other relatives and friends to mourn his loss.

At the time of his death Mr. Hicks was employed by the Kentucky State Highway Dept.
