I hereby certify that I have for many years been well acquainted with Mrs Mary Turpin an applicant for a widows pension for revolutionary services of her husband - that in 1834 I married the daughter of said lady and am well acquainted with her family history - that she was the widow of Horatio Turpin a revolutionary soldier - that she married said Horatio in 1803, resided in Virginia until 1820 and then removed to Kentucky where said Horatio died - that Dr Turpin was a brother of said Horatio and was a person most likely to transact business for him - J. P. Wright

Declaration.

In Order to obtain the benefits of the second
Section of the Act of 3rd February, 1853,

District of Columbia D.
County of Washington G. D.

On this 7th day of October personally
appeared before the Orphans Court of the District of
Columbia, Washington County, Mary A. Turpin a
resident of Gallatin ~~in~~ County of the State of
Kentucky aged 68 years, who being first duly
sworn according to law, doth on her Oath make
the following declaration in order to obtain the
benefits of the provision made by the Act of Congress
passed on the 3rd February, 1853, granting pen-
sion to widows of persons who served during the
Revolutionary War, that she is the widow of Mora-
teo Turpin who was an Ensign of Infantry in the
Virginia Continental Line in the War of the Revolution.
She also states that her said husband was promoted
to the rank of a Captain. That he entered the ser-
vice in the ~~State of Virginia~~ State of Virginia and
served under ~~and~~ and service from
an early period of the War to near its close at
different periods she is unable to state how much
service he actually rendered.
She further declares that she was married

to the said Moratio Turpin on the day
of April eighteen hundred and three; that
her said husband died on the 8th day of October
1826; that she was not married to him prior
to the second of January eighteen hundred
but at the time stated above.

She further declares that she is now a
widow.

Declaration.

On this 22nd day of October, 1856, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County aforesaid Mary W. Turpin aged 68 years, a resident of the County of Gallatin in the State of Kentucky, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Weorath Turpin, &c., who was an Ensign in the War of the Revolution. That her husband served a month or fourteen days for the proof of his said service she refers to her papers on file in the Pension Office, under the Act of 3rd Feb. 1853. She further states that she was married to the said Weorath Turpin in the County of Cumberland State of Tennessee, on the day of April A.D. 1803. by Rev. Mr. Hopkins a Minister of the Gospel, and that her name before he was married was Mary Ann Banerff and for the proof of which she also refers to her pension papers under Act 3rd Feb. 1853, as above stated and that she is still a widow. She has never before applied for, nor rec^d. land under this or any other Act of Congress. She has not married since the death of her said husband. She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which she may be entitled under the last paper branch 3rd 1855. She requests the Court of Pensions to issue the Warrant to the Surveyor General accordingly.

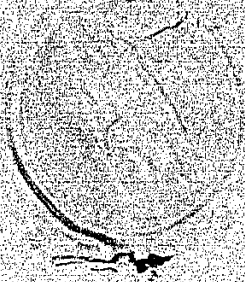
