

Appraiser B. F. LaMaster Dies

Was Ex-Official Of Land Bank

Benjamin F. LaMaster, an appraiser for the Army Corps of Engineers, died at 6:35 p.m. Thursday at Kentucky Baptist Hospital. He lived at 3001 Lexington Road.

LaMaster was a vice-president of the Federal Land Bank here in the early 1940's. He also had been a livestock buyer and broker, a Veterans Administration employee, and a meat-price specialist for the Kentucky district of the Office of Price Stabilization.

In World War I he was a first lieutenant in the Army. He attended the University of Kentucky.

LaMaster, a member of the Christian Church in his native New Castle, is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mae Coleman LaMaster; two sons, Benjamin T. and William H. LaMaster; two sisters, Mrs. Edna Hayden, Eminence, and Mrs. Lucy Smith, Frankfort; a brother, Arnett LaMaster, New Castle, and seven grandchildren.

The funeral will be at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at Herbert Cralle Funeral Home, 2428 Frankfort Avenue. Burial will be in New Castle Cemetery.
