## C. W. LaMaster, Farmer At Fisherville, Dies of Typhoid

The doctor said Mr. LaMaster probably drank tainted water in a spring on one of the farms on

which he worked, and added that recent heavy rains had washed considerable filth into rural springs. He said, however, it was the only such case in the neighborhood.

Survivors are Mr. LaMaster's mother, Mrs. Laura Frederick La-Master; two brothers, Hugh La-Master and Samuel LaMaster, and three sisters, Miss Lilly La-Master, Miss Edith LaMaster and Miss Katie May LaMaster.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday at Myers' Chapel at Jeffersontown, and at 2:30 p.m. at Trinity Church of Christ. Burial will be in Bethlehem Cemetery.
