

- I, D. D. Robertson of Calhoon, Ky., being of sound mind and disposing memory and desiring to dispose of my estate in such manner as to me seems right and proper, do hereby make and publish this as my last will and testament :
- (1) Thereby revoke all former wills or codicils made by me.
 - (2) I desire that out of my estate all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.
 - (3) I hereby give and devise to my wife Sallie E. Robertson, all of my household goods and kitchen furniture, and my horse and buggy, and one cow absolutely.
 - (4) I hereby direct that my executors place on deposit in some safe bank the sum of Twenty Five Hundred Dollars at interest, and that the same be renewed annually during the life or widowhood of my wife Sallie E. Robertson, and that during said time beginning October, 15th, 1906, my said wife Sallie E. Robertson shall be paid so much of said fund including principal and interest, as shall amount to Two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) Dollars per annum.
 - (5) I hereby give devise and bequeath unto my said wife, Sallie E. Robertson, for her life or so long as she may remain my widow, the house and lots, including all out houses in Calhoon, Ky., now occupied by me and her as a homestead.
 - (6) All the rest of my estate real, personal and mixed, including the fee in the homestead and whatever may remain of the Twenty-five hundred Dollars in clause # 40 of this will, I hereby give devise and bequeath equally to my three children Jacob T. Robertson, John E. Robertson and Rena Tillotson, so that each one shall be made equal in the distribution of my estate. In doing this my daughter, Rena Tillotson, shall be and is charged with the sum of Twenty-five hundred Dollars, the value of land heretofore conveyed to her, and the further sum of Two hundred Dollars, the value of one piano received by her. I hold notes against my sons Jacob T. Robertson and John E. Robertson for sums advanced to them at different times, as will be shown by said notes and for which they they are each to be and are now hereby charged in the distribution of of said estate.
 - (7) For the purpose of making such distribution of my estate it is my will that my tracts of land be sold as also the crops therein, and my executors hereinafter named, are hereby given power, as such, to convey a perfect title to same, but no such sale shall interfere with contracts of renting already made by me of any portion of said land.
 - (8) I hereby nominate and appoint as executors of this my will, my sons, Jacob T. Robertson, John E. Robertson, and my son-in-law Elbridge Tillotson, and direct that they qualify as such without bond.
