I William E .Robertson,of McLean County Kentucky,being sick and weak in body ,but of sound mind and disposing memory,and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with,

I give and bequeath the same in manner following,that is to say:

- 1st. I desire that after my decease all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.
- 2nd. I desire that my wife,Cordelia Robertson,have all my real and personal estate,except herein after specified,during her natural life or as long as she may remain my widow,but if she should again marry,then such part of said estate as the law provides,and that after her death said estate bath real and presonal shall be equally divided between my children,namely,Mark T. Susan C. William G. Margaret E. ^{Mary E.} Anna,Cordelia,and John E. to be enjoyed by them forever.
- 3rd. I desire that my son John E. have my bay horse,one bed and bedding,and one cow,and calf or their equivelant.
- 4th. I desire that my daughter Cordelia,have my black horse,one bed and bedding one cow,and calf or their equivelant.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Cordelia Robertson Executrix of this my last Will and Testament,and that my son John E. assist my wife in carrying out the provisions of this will.
