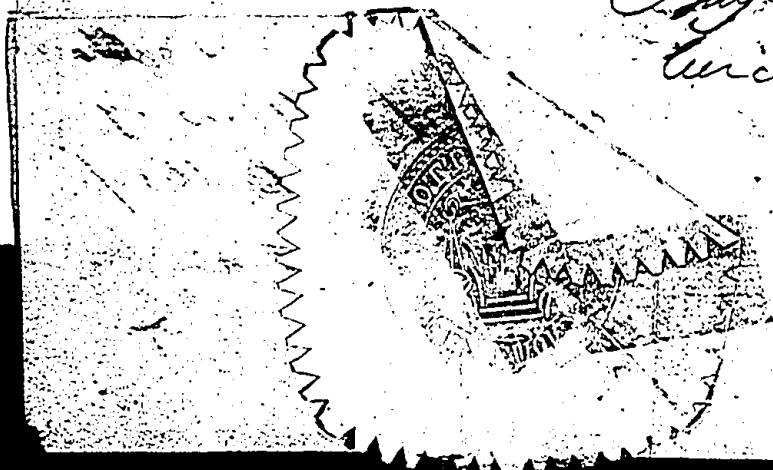
On this 7th of Sept^r 1818 before me
the undersigned one of the Clerks of the
Court in the aforesaid County personally appeared Joseph
James aged 66 years resident in ~~the~~
County and District aforesaid who being by
me first duly sworn according to Law
both as to his oath make the following
declaration in order to obtain the provisions
made by the late act of Congress entitled
an act to provide for certain persons
engaged in the land and naval service
of the United States in the Revolutionary
war. That he enlisted in the year 1775
in the state of Virginia for ^{two} ~~more~~ ~~months~~
in the company commanded by Capt George
Dobblefield in the regiment commanded by
Colo. Peachy in the continental establishment
that he served out said time and was discharged
about 18 miles above Philadelphia by
Colo. Lawson. That he was in the Battles of
German Town, Monmouth and others. That
he is in reduced circumstances and

stands in need of the assistance of his
Country for support and that he has no
other resource now in his power of his
Services to be declared before
me this day and year as follows

I Benj. Johnson Judge do hereby
certify that it appears to my satisfaction
that the said Joseph Searcy had served in
the Revolutionary war as stated in the
preceding declaration against the common
enemy for the term of nine months in
the Continental establishment and that he
is in reduced circumstances in life
and I now transmit the proceedings before
me to the Secretary for the Department
of War pursuant to the act of Congress
which may stand this 7th of Sept 1818

Dear Sir:

The data furnished below were obtained from papers on file in the pension claim, S. 35462, based upon the military service of Joseph James.

He enlisted in 1775, place not stated, and served two years as private with the Virginia troops under Captain George Stubblefield and Colonels Peachy and Lawson and was in the battle of Germantown. He also stated that he was in the battle of Monmouth but no details of this service were given.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 7, 1818, at which time he was sixty-six years of age and was living in Scott County, Kentucky.

The papers in this pension claim contain no data relative to the soldier's family.

The above noted is the only Joseph James from Scott County, Kentucky, that is found in the Revolutionary War records of this office.
