KNOW all Men by these Presents, That we *Jacob Burns*
and Elizabeth Burns

are held and firmly bound unto *Peter Hoyle* Esquire Chairman
of said court, in the sum of *seventy*
Pounds, current money, to be paid to the said *Peter*
or his successors; to the which payment well and truly to be made, we bind
ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators, jointly and severally,
firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this *19th*
day of *October* Anno Domini 1813

THE CONDITION of this Obligation is such, that if the above bounden
Jacob Burns
administrator of all and singular the goods and chattles, rights and credits
of *Hannah Burns* deceased, do make or cause to be made,
a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods and chattles, rights
and credits of the deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, knowledge,
or possession of the said *Jacob Burns*
or into the hands or possession of any person or persons for *him*; and the
same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into *Smith* county
court, within the time prescribed by law, after the date of these presents:
And the same goods, chattles and credits, and all other the goods, chattles
and credits of the deceased, at the time of *her* death, or which at any time
hereafter shall come into the hands or possession of the said *Jacob*
Burns or into the hands or possession of any other
person or persons for *him* do well and truly administer according to law;
and further do make, or cause to be made, a true and just account of *his* said
administration, agreeable to law, after the date of these presents: and all the
rest and residue of the said goods, chattles and credits, which shall be found
remaining upon the said administrat account (the same being first allowed by
the Governor and Council, Superior or County Court shall deliver and pay
unto such person or persons respectively as the same shall become due, pur-
suant to the true intent and meaning of the act in that case made and provided.
And if it shall appear that any will or testament was made by the deceased, and
the executor or executors therein named do exhibit the same in court, making
request to have it allowed and approved of accordingly, if the said *Jacob*
Burns - - - above bounded being thereunto required, do ren-
der and deliver the said letters on administration, (approbation of such testa-
ment being first had and made in the said court) then this obligation to be
void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
